


BUSINESS ECONOMY OF AMERICA CONFERENCES

The Business Economy of America is a 3-day virtual conference that introduces students to factors that move the U.S., and Global Economies. Hot topics included interest rates and inflation, the rise of artificial intelligence, the boom and bust cycle of business, and ways to grow a business in this new tech environment. This conference serves as a high-level introductory seminar.

Additionally, students learn life and leadership lessons, like: how to prepare for college, financial literacy tips, the importance of having a positive mental attitude, and communication skills.

SUMMER BUSINESS CAMP COMPETITIONS

This session is a week-long business camp, delivered through the principles of mergers and acquisitions. Throughout the week, YAB students worked in teams and learned from accountants, analysts, attorneys, investment bankers, human resource executives, marketing executives, and IT professionals about the process of buying or selling a company.

In 2023, over 300 executives joined to work alongside students. This process helped teach students about many of the aspects of how a business works and did so in a competitive environment.



CHAMPIONSHIP CAMP



The 2023 Championship Camp was hosted in a hybrid environment July 17th- 21st. The case involved the future of fitness: Nike and Planet Fitness competing to buy Xponential Brands, parent company of the worlds best fitness classes, including Pure Barre, Rumble, and Row House. The top teams from across the country were invited to compete in this fun and engaging competition.

Championship Camp Highlights:

- Columbia Business School hosted mock shareholder sessions, a M&A overview, and negotiations at their Manhattanville Campus.
- Three YAB Alumni from Goldman Sachs advised a set of student teams during their Investment Banking Session.
- Final presentations were hosted by Sony at their Headquarters in New York City.
- A panel of judges reviewed the shareholder reports from each team. Our National Champs below won shares of stock!

ADVANCED CAMP COMPETITION









The 2023 Advanced Camp case was hosted for returning 2nd and 3rd year YAB students.

The focus of this industry-specific case was waste management and sustainability, created in conjunction with our partners at WM and Epic.

Students were organized into teams as public waste management companies, tech companies, and local municipalities to resolve a pressing waste management issue. Solutions ranged from solving capacity issues to ensuring worker safety through technology improvements.

Students toured a recycling facility, visited a landfill, and received advisory from waste management professionals to complete their cases.

YEAR-ROUND PROGRAMMING





YAB students were invited to take part in the Year-Round Programming seminars each month.

Meetings are held virtually or regionally at least one per month, with the intention of expanding business knowledge and increasing financial literacy.

Corporate and foundation support was instrumental in helping YAB accomplish its goals.

The Full Scholarship awarded to eligible students is \$2,000 per student. Our annual cost per student is \$2,999 for the virtual iteration of our delivery model. This leaves students and their families with a balance of \$799 that covers their participation in Business Economy of America, the Summer Business Camp, a portion of the Championship Camp, and the Year-Round Leadership Development Training.
